## **Safety Tips for Household Cleaning**

During Covid-19 outbreak, good housekeeping practices are essential to the safety in the workplace, as well as in the home. Most cleaning products contain some form of acid or base to produce their cleaning action. By themselves, this reactivity is generally low enough to be used safely, but mixed together, acids and bases can create severe hazards. **NEVER MIX** 

#### **ACIDS WITH BASES!**

- Hard water/mineral deposit removers
- Toilet bowl cleaners
- Rust removers
- Tub and tile cleaners
- Mold removers
- Vinegar

Common cleaning products that contain **bases** include:

- Bleach & bleach-containing products
- Oven cleaners
- Glass & all-purpose cleaners (often contain ammonia)
- Drain cleaners
- Laundry detergents
- Baking soda

Bleach is one of the most common and effective household disinfectant cleaning products, but it is also one of the most dangerous, especially when mixed with other common household cleaners.

#### **Natural Bleach Alternative:**

#### **Ingredients:**

- 3/4 cups of hydrogen peroxide
- 1/4 cup of lemon juice
- 1 Tbsp of citric acid (optional)
- Distilled Water to fill

#### Instructions

- Pour all the ingredients into a glass bottle (if you add the citric acid swish until it dissolves)
- Fill the rest of the jug with distilled water and use as you would bleach.
- Make sure to label the bottle



# **Tribal Response Program—Brownfields**

#### What is a Brownfields site?

#### Are you living or working near a Brownfields site?

- A Brownfield property is described under the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a "real property, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant."
- It could be any property such as land or an abandoned building that sits underdeveloped and/or unused because of perceived or actual contamination.

#### **Examples of Brownfield sites:**

- Cedar Creek Store
- Salt River Store
- McNary Wastewater Treatment System





The Maintenance building was suspected for lead and asbestos and it was confirmed with a Phase II Assessment. Phase II Assessment is when the contractor samples the flooring tiles, ceiling panels, etc. and sends to a certified laboratory. The building was demolished and is now a parking space for the Head Start Program.
