Tribal Plan and Project Review (TPPR)

Purpose:

The Tribal Plan and Project Review (TPPR) process is to ensure that all projects and plans occurring on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation are better coordinated and are consistent with Tribal and Federal laws, policies, and regulations and more importantly, to protect and conserve the vast and critically important natural resources of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

Procedures:

Step 1: Obtain Required Resource Clearances and Approvals

You must request and obtain clearances from appropriate review resources to ensure compliance with the following authorities:

TPPR Checklist:

- **Cultural Center (338-4625)** – Cultural Resources, Intellectual Property Rights
- **Tribal Historic Preservation Office (338-3033)** – Historic Preservation
- **Tribal Forestry (338-1665)** - Forest or Woodland Resources
- **Wildlife and Outdoor Recreation (338-4385)** - Threatened, Endangered, Sensitive Species Concerns, Wildlife and Fish Habitat, Recreational Uses
- **Hydrology Program (338-2471 or 338-2475)** - Hydrologic Concerns, Mineral extraction, Land surface/erosion mitigation, Water Uses/Rights/Qualities, Herbicides/Pesticides Concerns
- **Land Office (338-2588)** – Land Assignments, Increase use of lands and resources
- **Environmental Protection Office (338-2474)** – Air Quality, Water Quality, SWPPP, 401 Certification,

Step 2: A complete packet with TPPR Checklist shall be forwarded to the TPPR Coordinator by the second Wednesdays of each month.
