RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE PORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation that,

WHEREAS, the Arisona State Righmay Department desires to improve and reconstruct a portion of State Righmay No. 73 (Project S 201 (2)) for a distance of approximately 11 miles between McMary and the east boundary of the reservation, consent of the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for a charge in the existing right-of-way for said pertion in accordance with right-of-way map submitted is hereby granted, provided that no trees other than those designated by the Forestry Division of the Indian Service may be cut, removed, or damaged, and title to the remaining trees within the right-of-way is reserved to the tribe, and any fences disturbed by this change shall be replaced by the State Highway Department,

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that trees reseved in accordance with the above be handled in accord with Resolution No. 52-4, and that further damage is hereby waived, and

Bh IT FURTHER RESULVED that application of the State Highway Department to take materials from aix gravel pits adjacent to the above at standard rates of pay for such removal is hereby approved.

The foregoing mesolution was on March 24, 1952 duly adopted by a vote of for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (a) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
