

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 51-14, dated May 7, 1951, the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe did approve the application of the Phelps Dodge Corporation for right-of-way on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for the purpose of making deliveries of water from Showlow Creek into Salt River, and

WHEREAS, informal amended application has been presented by the Corporation substituting a pipeline and pumping plant for the tunnel originally proposed, providing an annual rental of \$250 plus 10¢ per acre foot of water delivered into Forestdale Creek, and including additional provisions for safeguarding tribal lands and tribal water rights, and

WHEREAS, the terms of the amended application are acceptable to the council,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the amended application be approved and all provisions in Resolution 51-14 not in conflict with the amended resolution are hereby continued in effect.

The foregoing Resolution was on March 24, 1952 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (A) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938; pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
