

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS**, by Resolution No. 308 dated December 6, 1949, the Council approved a general representation contract with James E. Curry as Chief Attorney, and C. M. Wright as Associate Attorney, and

**WHEREAS**, said contract reads in Part as follows:

"4. Duration. This contract shall be effective for a period of 5 years beginning on 1 January 1950 and ending on 31 December 1954; Provided, however, that it may be sooner terminated;

e. By the tribe at any time with or without notice, and with or without cause, in which event the liability of the tribe shall be limited to compensation at the rate specified in Paragraph 6 hereof for services rendered, and to reimbursement of out-of-pocket expenditures in connection therewith as provided in paragraph 7 hereof, prior to and including but not after the date of notification to the Chief Attorney or the Associate Attorney by the aforesaid Tribal Council of such termination." and

**WHEREAS**, the Council no longer desires to retain the services of the Attorneys,

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the said contract between the Tribe and James E. Curry as Chief Attorney and C. M. Wright as Associate Attorney be, and is hereby terminated by the Council.

The foregoing Resolution was on March 26, 1952 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (b) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
