RESOLUTION OF THE MUNITAIN APACHE TRIES OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

MHEREAS, there will be continuing need for educational facilities on this reservation, and

MIEREAS, the Whiteriver Public School district has applied for an assignment of land at Whiteriver for a school leastion.

Tribe hereby consents and agrees that the United States Cosmissioner of Education, as Administrator under and pursuant to Public Law 815, 81st Congress, may erect or cause to be erected upon the hereinafter described premises, a school and school facilities, may cause the same to be conducted and operated by such agency as he may select, and may continue to maintain the same or cause the same to be maintained on said premises, until otherwise legally disposed of.

The premises above referred to may be more particularly described as a tract of tribal land approximately 10 acres in area located east of the nurses, home and described on the attached map, and

- BE IT FURTHER BESOLVED that the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby also consents and agrees to furnish water, electric, sewage and other utilities or services, if evailable, for the facilities, PROVIDED that the cost thereof shall be reimbursed to the White Mountain Apache Tribe in accordance with existing laws and regulations governing such reimbursement. If such utilities or services are unavailable or imadequate, the Commissioner of Education may obtain them from other sources, and
- BE IT FULTHER RESCLIVED that the Council of the White Meuntain Apache Tribe hereby grants to the Commissioner, or his designee, all necessary rights of ingress and agress ever the reservation for the purpose of constructing and operating the school facilities,

The foregoing resolution was on August 16, 1952, duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VIII of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1958 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1954 (48 Stat. 984).
