

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the money received by the tribe from sale of fishing permits now amounts to about \$10,000 per year, and the permits are sold for the tribe by 55 dealers in stores and shops all over the state,

AND WHEREAS, these dealers now receive no compensation for their services as they do in selling state licenses,


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Superintendent be authorized to make agreements or contracts with the dealers in which the dealers may be paid 5% (five per cent) of the receipts they collect. The Superintendent may also be authorized to require the dealers to furnish bond if he deems it necessary. Dealers doing business on reservation lands and not paying rent therefor are to be excluded from this compensation.

The foregoing Resolution was on March 24, 1952 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (p) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
