

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Reservation that,

WHEREAS, the cost of maintaining facilities for the use of fishermen and of assisting in the stocking of streams and of miscellaneous administrative services have increased greatly in recent years, the following rates shall be charged for fishing permits effective July 1, 1952:


Resident Permit, 50¢ per month or \$5.00 per year.

Non-Resident Permit, 60¢ for one day, 30¢ for each additional day, \$3.00 for ten days, \$15.00 for one year.

The foregoing Resolution was on March 24, 1952 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (p) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
