

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Council has approved the extension to reservation streams of the regulations of the Arizona Game and Fish Commission which remove the closed season and size and weight limits on trout, and

WHEREAS, this action adds to the concern of the Council that the native trout which are found only in the headwaters of the reservation streams are in danger of extinction, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Reservation that the following areas on the reservation be closed to fishing and camping until further notice and that the areas be posted with appropriate signs:

- Big Bonito Creek from mouth of Hurricane Creek to headwaters.
- All of Squaw Creek.
- All of Flash Creek.
- East Fork of Whiteriver from the Canyon mouth to the headwaters.
- Big Diamond Creek above the beaver dams.
- Paradise Creek above the Paradise Park drift fence.

The foregoing Resolution was on March 24, 1952 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (p) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
